The 2007 Socio-economic Assessment of Ein El-Hilweh Refugee Camp Survey Questionnaires



General introduction

The survey used two different questionnaires. These were:

1. The <u>household questionnaire</u>, which collects data about: (a) the living area, housing and infrastructure; (b) the household as a unit (e.g. satisfaction with dwelling and living area, income and durable goods); and (c) each household member (e.g. gender and age, civil status, health, education and employment). Respondent was the head of household or another knowledgeable adult household member, and sometimes more than one person sat in during the interview.

2. The <u>questionnaire for the Randomly Selected Individual</u> (RSI) aged 15 and over, which collects information from and about the perception and opinion of the sampled household member through a face-to-face interview in private and without the attendance of other household member—except in some cases young children. Thematically, the questionnaire focused on health, education and employment.
